Mental disorders should be considered as an underlying cause of family dysfunction and should be diagnosed and treated to save the family. No divorce should be allowed before ruling out treatable mental disease. Divorce pronouncements or requests for divorce of people with mental disorders have no legal effect because of deficient legal competence (*ahliyyat*).

without the ability to pay university's tuition fees. Among these students one day they may be the community's leaders, such as scholars, engineers, medical doctors, discoverers, IT experts, politicians, scientists, economists, accountant, statistical, engineers, etc. Therefore, the research suggests that the educational waste represents paradox, by solving it through giving poor student loans to continue their education, this will help in the development of nations.

The educational waste which is one of the main hindrance of development should be removed to achieve the goal: Smooth education for those who are competent and clever enough to participate positively in the process of development. This paradox and problem would be solved by giving loans without interest to university students, for their tuition fees. This is suggested by establishing a fund for giving loans to students. The fund's resources are based on endowment where donations pour in the fund on loan basis and voluntary "تطوع" money (Sadaqat), not only that even Zakat money should help in supporting fund's revenues, as students eligible for taking loans are amongst poor and needy: these are one sect of beneficiaries of Zakat, verse, 60, Surat Al-tawbah, the Holy Quran.

#### Summary

**Problem Statement:** Educational waste affects adversely development as general and economic development in particular. Due to poverty educational waste is increasing, because many of qualified, clever and intelligent student abandons education because they have no enough money to pay fees for continuing their university education.

**Purpose:** establishing a Loan Fund to pay for poor student's tuition fees on loan without interest basis and to be repaid back, by the students themselves after being employed or being able to pay back.

**Solution:** the fund will be established on endowment idea to collect money from wealthy persons and financial institutions, like banks, insurance, Reinsurance Companies, industries and agricultural firms... the revenue of the fund will be on loan basis and/or donations.

The fund will extend loans to eligible students to continue their university education.

**Establishment:** All formal and legal procedures are needed for the inauguration of the Loan Fund.

**Licenses:** Required licenses should be acquired from the specialized authorities.

Registration of the funds also required.

**Marketing:** a marketing campaign for the fund to be financed is also required. This will be established in the university to look over the Fund, manages, directs and suggests candidates among university's student who are eligible for interest free.




