Peace and War: Between Islam and Neojihadist Ideology, Values and Strategies

Abstract

Peace and War presents a critical analysis of the phenomenon of neojihadism. The book presents neojihadism as a 21st century extremist and radical movement that engages in the distortion of the mean-



ing of Jihad as understood in mainstream Islam. The book examines the fundamental processes of ideological extremism, the meaning and scope of terrorism, the basic processes involved in neojihadist radicalisation and the way in which globalisation forces have contributed to shaping neojihadism as a typically novel 21st century phenomenon. Peace and War is therefore an important reading for anyone interested in understanding the intersection between neojihadism and other similar violent new religious movements, and the various dimensions of ideological radicalisation and terrorism as important challenges to contemporary peace and international relations.

Source of Secular Ethics: European Ethical Theories

There is no one authoritative source of secular ethics. There are several theories that make discussion complex. The utilitarian consequence-based theory of Jeremy Bentham 1747-1832 & John Stuart Mill 1806-1873 looks at ethics as



the balance of good and bad, ethics is relative, and there is no absolute right and wrong. The obligation-based theory of Immanuel Kant 1724-1804 emphasizes moral obligations and asserts absolute right and absolute wrong. The rights-based theory is based on respect for the human rights of the individual who is free to decide what is ethical and what is not. The community-based theory asserts that what the community considers moral is what is moral.

Islamic Values

Islamic values (القيم الاخلاقية) are universal human values that shape the human personality and behavior and are applicable to every place and time. They are not exclusive to Muslims others may share some of them with Muslims. Values reflect the basic fitra of the human and are consonant with the mission of the human on earth which is ibadat in its widest sense manifested at the societal level by the three concepts of: istikhlaf (استخلاف), taskhiir (سنخلاف), and isti'maar (استعمار). The three are closely related to respect for life. Values are understandable from appreciating the duality of the human as nafs and jasad as well as the balance between the two in varying circumstances. To be continued...
